Why do I need travel insurance?

It is important to have a Saskatchewan Blue Cross International Student Travel Plan in your backpack while studying outside Canada, to ensure you are protected in the event of an illness or accident. Not all medical expenses are covered by Saskatchewan Health, so take us with you when you leave!

Who is eligible for coverage?

Full-time students age 18 and over with a valid Saskatchewan Health Services card attending an accredited educational institution outside Canada who have not applied for permanent residency in the country in which he/she is studying.

Spouse and dependent children who accompany the student are also eligible to enrol.

Accidental Death & Dismemberment Benefits

Up to \$50,000 per person for accidental death or dismemberment while travelling. Coverage is provided 24 hours a day.

What steps should I take if I require medical attention while travelling?

Contact the Saskatchewan Blue Cross Travel Assistance Provider within 24 hours of your medical emergency. Assistance is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Be prepared to provide your policy number, trip information and a brief description of the medical emergency.

Why do I need to contact the Travel Assistance Provider?

In a medical emergency, our Travel Assistance Provider will direct you to the nearest medical facility equipped to provide the treatment you need. They will contact our office to confirm your benefits and keep us updated on your medical situation. If required, they will also arrange transfer to another medical facility or evacuation to Saskatchewan, and assist in contacting your family.
